## **Plains Indian:**

Story Teller Hides: Painted deer, elk, and buffalo hides that tell ones life history, battles, hunts or any thing that was of importance.

Parfleche: Items made of raw hide elk, beef, buffalo they were used to carry food, clothing or any kind of goods they may have. Envelopes, guest boxes, or any design you may want.

Wood or Horn Bows: Wood bows made of ash, oak, cherry, osage, plain or sinew backed horn .

Weapons: Stone war clubs, lances 4' to 6' with or with out feather trailers, tomahawks, knives of metal or stone,.

Shields: Shields are made of two layers of rawhide, 18 to 22 inches, heavy beef or buffalo, and come with designs of the time or your own.

Pipes: Pipes are 18" long come with pipe stone bowls or antler, beaded, feather fans under them and if desired a elk tooth at the mouth peace with a stand, pipe bag of Plains Indian design.

Quill work: 1700s to 1860s quill work plains colors unless asked for from large to small items

Bead work: 1800s to 1889 size 11 beads plains patterned colors same unless asked for.

## **Mountain man Items and raw product**

Shirts: Shirts are of deer or elk leather any style or a style you like.

Pants: or Leganés of deer or elk any style.

Gun cases : Leathers or wool measured to the size you need.

Feathers: White turkey feathers painted like young eagle. They come plain, plumed, painted stem or quilled and in sets if desired.

**Raw product:**

Raw hide of deer, elk , buffalo ready to make parfleche, drums, brain tan, what your needs maybe. Quill, roach hair, hooves, bone, horns , sinew from 18" to 36" all back strap. All raw product is seasonal during the winter months and is sold before June most of the time. If I do not have it I may know where to get it.
